In our last email, the Two Rivers Residents - Landfill Opposition Committee (TRR-LOC) encouraged all residents to sign an online petition asking the BOA to schedule a <u>Public</u> Hearing in the future so residents can provide their own views regarding the proposed landfill. **A whopping 873 residents signed the petition.** TRR-LOC forwarded the petition to the Chair of the BOA and some local politicians to communicate the high level of interest in landfill proceedings.

The upcoming <u>Appeal</u> Hearing is for legal arguments from the lawyers for the Landfill (NWM) and longtime residents (FOTPIA). The Zoom audience will only be able to observe and listen to the proceedings on June 23rd.

Hopefully, the BOA will schedule a future <u>Public</u> Hearing in response to our petition. TRR-LOC will keep you posted.

Even if you are busy on June 23rd, we encourage you to register for the <u>Appeal</u> Hearing. A large number of registrants for the <u>Appeals</u> Hearing helps communicate the ongoing interest of the public.

Historical Background Info

For those of you who are new to Two Rivers, the below info will help you get up to speed on the proposed landfill.


Since 1990, National Waste Managers (NWM) has been trying to complete the permitting process for their proposed Chesapeake Terrace Rubble Landfill (CTRL). Before construction can begin, permits are required from the Federal Government (Army Corps of Engineers), the State (MDE), and the County (AAC Planning & Zoning). NWM has been unable to obtain the State & County permits during the last 31 years due to the efforts of local opposition groups, particularly the Forks of the Patuxent Improvement Association (FOTPIA). The location of the proposed landfill is just north of Two Rivers (see attached sketch).

The permit clock stopped in October 2020. NWM would like to get approval to restart the permit clock. The BOA <u>Appeal</u> Hearing is one step in the legal process that NWM must overcome. The legal proceedings are moving very slowly, which is good for the opposition groups

In October 2019, a small group of volunteers formed the TRR-LOC. We have been reviewing documents from the last 31 years, developing opposition arguments, and contacting government officials & local opposition groups.
